Happy 104th Anniversary Marion Carnegie Library!

Marion Carnegie Library was opened to the public in February 1916. The building has undergone several renovations in the 104 years since. A major expansion took place in 1997 that added 12,000 square feet. The library stands on the site of the former "Grandma Cline" residence.

The building was constructed in 1915, with a grant of \$18,000 from the Andrew Carnegie Foundation. Marion Carnegie Library was opened to the public on February 29, 1916 with 1,162 volumes and 680 borrowers. Today's collection now exceeds 120,000 items, there are over 9,000 registered borrowers. The library averages more than 160,000 visitors each year. Materials available for check-out include books, magazines, DVDs, audiobooks, educational kits and digital content.
