This exhibit features displays on Native American rock art, pottery, stone tools and other artifacts investigated by CAI archaeologists over the past 40 years. A highlight of the exhibit is a cross-section of a several hundred year old cypress log that once marked the center of a AD 1000-1500 Native American village near St. Louis. The University Museum is open Tuesday-Friday: 10 a.m. - 4 p.m. and Saturday 1 p.m. - 4 p.m.
