South Seven Conference

Mr. Ohnesorge, MHS Principal, presented the rationale for voting not to accept Granite City HS as a conference member at the upcoming South 7 conference meeting. The three main reasons presented were the 'distance', which would negatively impact student instructional time; size of Granite City High School, which currently has an enrollment of 1,800 students and expected to increase, and potentially complicate football scheduling. The Board did not dispute the recommendation for the upcoming vote.

Agreement for School Board Policy Online Services

The Board voted 7-0 to approve the agreement between Marion CUSD #2 and the Illinois Association of School Boards for School Board Policy Online Services as presented.

Purchase of Property

The Board voted 6-0-1 to approve the purchase of 103 S. Ewan for \$45,000 and authorize the Superintendent and Chief Financial Officer to represent Marion CUSD #2 at closing.

General State Aid Payment Resolution

The Board voted 7-0 to adopt the resolution authorizing deposit of extraordinary general state aid payment into the education fund as presented.

Inter-Fund Loans

The Board voted 7-0 to authorize Superintendent Dr. Keith Oates to direct Treasurer Patrick Brown to loan, if necessary, amounts between existing funds, as provided in the Illinois School Code for customary expenditures, including but not limited to, payroll, utilities and regular monthly expenditures.
