Dance – The MHS Dance Team had an historic 21-22 season! Only three girls had varsitylevel competitive experience, and the underclassmen worked hard to become one of the most decorated dance teams in school history!! IHSA: The IHSA 1A competitive field began with 74 teams, and the Marion Dance team made it to not only the state preliminary round, but for the first time in school history, the squad placed 4th in the top 12 to compete in the final round. The team placed 7th overall in the IHSA state series. NDTC: The team also traveled to the National Dance Team Championships in Orlando, Florida where they placed 11th in the nation in the Large Varsity Kick division. Only 6 points separated 1st and 11th place. They also placed 23 out of 32 in the Pom division! IDTA: The team also traveled to Springfield for the IDTA State Finals where they were named State Champions in the AA Kick category. This is the 17th state title for the Varsity team! The squad also received 2nd place Grand Champion in overall scoring in the AA division. In addition, EVERY girl on the team was named as an IDTA Scholar Athlete. Each girl has a 3.5 and above GPA—what an accomplishment! Senior soloists Adriana Baysinger and Audrey Ide were named Top 15 finalists in the Miss IDTA soloist division. There were 44 soloists competing for this title, and Adriana placed 8th while Audrey placed 13th.


