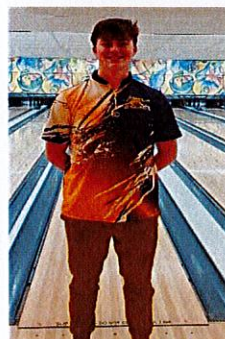
Basketball (Boys) – Rayzhaun Bardo and Evan Noelle made the Route 13 Christmas Classic All-Tournament Team.

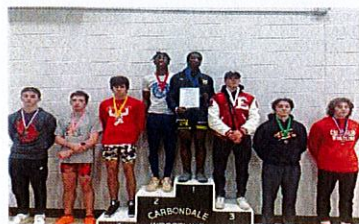


