Maintenance Report

Washington Elementary School: Tuckpointing on the brick for both gymnasiums have begun. Once tuckpointing has been completed then roof replacement will begin as well. The east gym will begin to be repainted on starting Monday the 16. The school will also be getting a new washer and dryer installed to better assist students in need of clean clothing. Specific rooms are getting a new coat of paint while others are getting some touch ups. The custodial team is also doing a great job at cleaning the rooms and resealing the floors.

<u>Lincoln Elementary School:</u> Some classrooms have been getting a fresh new coat of paint while others are getting touched up. The custodial team is also doing a great job at cleaning the rooms and resealing the floors.

High School: Roof replacement is well on its way for Wilson gym with the cafeteria roof to follow. There will be some new sidewalks added to some areas this summer along with some parking lot repairs. The carpet in the football field house is scheduled to be removed and a new rubber flooring is to be installed. Some classrooms and areas in the building are scheduled to be repainted and freshened up as well. HVAC upgrades should be completed within a few weeks. The custodial team is also doing a great job at cleaning the rooms and resealing all of the floors.

<u>Jr. High:</u> Roof replacement has begun on the east gym and is expected to last several weeks. The front of the east gym steps by mainstreet will be demoed out and fully replaced with new steps including a new handicap ramp. Areas of the building are scheduled to be painted. The hallway just east of the east gym is also scheduled to have a drop in ceiling installed. The custodial team is also doing a great job at cleaning the rooms and resealing the floors.

<u>Jefferson Elementary School:</u> A few classrooms are scheduled to get floors replaced with a new no wax flooring system. There are also numerous rooms scheduled to get ceiling mounted mini splits installed to help with the climate control of the rooms. Jefferson school will also be receiving a new much needed storage unit to be placed outside to help with the storage needs of the building. The custodial team is also doing a great job at cleaning the rooms and resealing the floors.

Adams: A new fence was installed around portions of the playground to assist in the safety and security of the students. There will also be a new blacktop drive that will add the front parking lot to the west side parking lot. Numerous interior windows are also scheduled to have a frost tint put on them for safety and security of those rooms. Some classrooms are on schedule to get painted and touched up. The custodial team is also doing a great job at cleaning the rooms and resealing the floors.

<u>Longfellow:</u> There are a few classrooms that will be getting new ceiling mounted mini splits to help with the climate control for those rooms.
