Marion High School

<u>Cross Country</u> – Both the Boys and Girls Cross Country teams placed second overall in the South Seven Conference. The following girls received all-conference honors: Isis Williams placed 10th overall and made second team all-conference and Mari Ray placed first and earned a spot on the all-conference first team. Mari Ray finished 4th overall at the Highland Regional and advanced to the Decatur Sectional. The following boys received all-conference honors: Logan Morgan and Benja Stone both made the second team. The cross country boys advanced to the Decatur Sectional as a team.

Football – MHS football ended their season with an 8-2 overall record, South Seven Co-Champs and made the playoffs for the 15th consecutive year.

Football (Freshman/Sophomore) – The Freshman/Sophomore football team finished the season with a perfect record (7-0). Wildcat football went (15-1) as a program during the regular 2019 season.

Tennis (Girls) – Girls tennis team finishes with its best season in program history with a 24-1 record and 4-0 in South Seven play. The girls also captured their first-ever conference title along with earning back-to-back sectional titles. Nicole Szidik earns the title of Sectional Champion and Margaux Bruce was the runner-up making them both state qualifiers. IHSA State results: Margaux Bruce won a round in the consolation bracket and Nicole Szidik made it through the first round but fell in the second; moving her to the back draw. Nicole advanced to round five before falling to Richmond. These two ladies earned Marion's highest team finish of 15th place (79 schools) at the State Finals. Nicole Szidik finishes the season 26-2 (those losses came at the state finals). She ends her high school tennis career by moving into the All-Time Leading Scorer for the girls' program. She was also named to the Girls Tennis Second Team All-State. She is the only tennis player to have been name to two All-State teams during her high school career.

<u>**Cross Country (Boys)**</u> – Dylon Nalley won the SIJHSAA Class L Boys State Cross Country race with a time of 9:53.9. Cade Parks finished in eighth place. As a team the boys finished in 10^{th} place overall.

<u>Cross Country (Girls)</u> – Kara Odum was the top finisher for the girls team with a fourteenth place finish. The girls team finished in 15th place overall.
